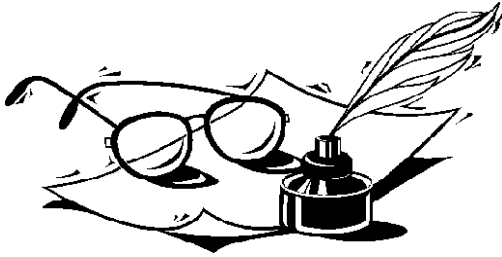

from the Pastor's Pen

Stephen Cavness, the pastor of Cave City BC in Cave City, KY, published an article in the January 2011 edition of *Homelife* (pp. 28-29), "10 Things You May Not Know About Your Pastor." I want to become transparent with you as I live out my calling in hopes that you will search your hearts and become open to God's will for your lives and the life of the church. I'm finishing up this series this month. . .

- Ninth, *it bothers me when I can't make your situation better.* It's not that I want to be the hero and swoop in and save the day or solve all of the world's problems. However, I'm praying that your marriage will work out after experiencing a rocky patch. I hope your rebellious child will feel Jesus' love through you and draw closer to Him. I want your parents to show you the affection, encouragement and support you need to continue to grow as a Christian. I want the memories of someone lying about you and emotionally hurting you to become a thing of the past. I pray you will overcome your doubts that God is real or that your faith is genuine. I believe God is in control and that He alone can heal ALL wounds and preform miracles that positively impact lives. But when my prayers don't produce immediate results, my heart hurts for you and I wish I could fix things if it were in my power to do it.
- Tenth, *I want, more than anything else, for your labor to bring honor and glory to God.* I know I've really messed up sometimes. I simply should have and could have done a better job visiting, making a quick phone call to remind folks of an important meeting, or been better prepared for Sunday morning. My calling as a pastor often overwhelms me because I know how inadequate I am. I long for you to get it right, in spite of me, because I love God and you, and I want to watch you grow spiritually. And when God gets the glory and you reap the benefits, I relish in the joy that the church is rooted in Jesus Christ and is being led by the Holy Spirit to make a difference in our world for Him.

I look forward to continuing this Christian journey with you!
